Francis Gary Powers, Jr. – One-time only event!

For more than three decades, Francis Gary Powers, Jr. has thrilled global audiences with tales of the Cold War, its veterans, espionage, and his father, Gary Powers. A CIA pilot, Gary was flying a U-2 plane when shot down over the Soviet Union on May 1, 1960. The U-2 Incident was immortalized in Steven Spielberg's 2015 film Bridge of Spies, depicting the pilot's exchange for Soviet KGB Spy Rudolph Able in 1962. Powers delves into his role as a film consultant, his upbringing in the shadow of a Cold War icon, and how his research led to posthumous awards for his father from the USAF and CIA in 2000 and 2012. 
